The impact of Coronavirus on vulnerable children and families in Scotland

At Aberlour, we are seeing first-hand the profound impact the COVID-19 pandemic is having on families we work with, many of whom are already in the grip of poverty. We are encountering extraordinary challenges in making sure children, young people and families continue to get the practical, emotional and financial support they badly need.

During the past few months, we've had to radically change and adapt how we deliver support, as well as how we communicate and maintain contact and connections with those who need us.

The resilience and determination of our staff as they respond to this crisis has been both incredible and humbling, so many of our people go above and beyond to ensure that vital support, a lifeline for many, remains available to families at a time when it is needed most.

Our services normally support thousands of families across Scotland, and we anticipate the level of need will continue to rise steeply as a result of current circumstances.

Families already at breaking point are struggling, and across the country many more families than usual are requesting our help. Working alongside the Scottish Government, local authorities and other public services, Aberlour aims to make sure no child, young person or family is left in need. Our joined up and collective approach has never been needed more than at this time of national crisis.

We have seen thousands of children and their families across Scotland either falling into poverty or being pushed deeper into poverty, as a result of Coronavirus. For that reason, we have also increased the direct financial support we provide to struggling families through our Urgent Assistance Fund, which provides basic and essential items for families which they couldn't otherwise afford. We've received applications from people who have never needed our support before; from people who have lost their jobs and don't have enough money to feed their children while they wait for their first Universal Credit payment.

Thanks to you, our supporters and donors, we have provided cash grants to almost 2,000 families; we are so thankful to everyone who has donated to help families with children who are suffering extreme financial hardship. You can see what an incredible impact your kindness has had on pages 4 and 5.

Ryan's^{*} story

Seven-year-old Ryan's parents had been struggling to put food on the table.

Due to COVID-19, they were pushed further into poverty. When we heard how the family was struggling, some of our staff members popped round to the family's home to drop off some cooked meals, but we discovered the family had no way of warming them up. Thanks to donations to our Urgent Assistance Fund, we were able to buy the family a microwave; making Ryan's day. Grinning, he told our staff: "My dream has come true! I dreamt of having our own microwave one day".



Building a new home-from-home

For families of children with a disability, short breaks can provide an enjoyable experience for the child or young person, and a much-needed break for their parents and siblings.

In Aberdeen, we're working to build brandnew premises, which will provide more children with a safe, caring, home-fromhome base for community activities and support for parents and siblings.

Working in partnership with Aberdeen City Council and Grampian Autistic Society, our new service will provide a Wellbeing Hub which offers home care, community and residential short breaks, and an exciting, tailored programme of activities and support for children with disabilities, overseen by our expert staff.

Aberlour's Assistant Director Beverley Hart said: "Families come in all shapes and sizes, and we understand that family life with a child with a disability brings both joys and unique challenges. We're so excited to be developing this new home-from-home facility to enable greater inclusion, connection and choice for these families."

Our new centre, due to open in November 2020, will support children with disabilities and their families from across the city; giving children the chance to have new experiences and make new friends while giving their parents the vital opportunity to recharge their batteries.

A decade of changing lives

Ten years ago, Rose arrived in Scotland from Nigeria, as an unaccompanied child who'd come to Scotland in search of safety. Alone and afraid, she was supported to recover and seek sanctuary in Scotland. She had one dream; to become a nurse.

Rose was one of the first people helped by our Scottish Guardianship Service, which we launched a decade ago, in partnership with the Scottish Refugee Council.

Through this service, we help young people like Rose – refugees and victims of trafficking – to navigate the UK's complex immigration system, while providing them with vital information and support. Our Guardians listen to and understand these young people; they respect their resilience as survivors; they ensure young people get actively involved in the decisions that will affect them and their future in Scotland.

This work hasn't stopped during the pandemic; our teams have adapted by helping young people to attend their legal appointments via video conferencing. We've joined nearly 500 such appointments in the last three months.



Ten years on, Rose now lives in England where she has been working as a nurse in a critical care department during the pandemic. We know that with the right support, children and young people who have experienced unimaginable horrors, can have a fulfilling future, and indeed become indispensable members of the communities where they settle.

Summer Term in Lockdown

When Scotland went into lockdown, school children across the country found themselves trying to complete their schooling at home. Among them, was Chris Debenham, a young person supported by Aberlour Youthpoint in Moray.

Like 700,000 other children across the UK, Chris didn't have access to a laptop at home, making his school work a struggle.

Thanks to a joint initiative run by Aberlour, Children 1st and the Scottish Government's 'No One Left Behind' scheme, Chris was one of hundreds of children to be given a laptop to make keeping up with school easier. Chris even featured on a special edition of the BBC's children's news programme, Newsround; 'Summer Term in Lockdown' where he talked about the difficulties he'd faced when his school had closed. "When I got the laptop it really helped me do my school work. It made me so happy and I've improved my writing and reading as well."
